ORDERED:

1. That the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure for the United States District Courts be, and they hereby are, amended by including therein amendments to Criminal Rules 11(c), 32(a) and (c), 32.1(a) and (b), 40(d) and 41(e) as hereinafter set forth:

2. That the foregoing amendments to the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure shall take effect on December 1, 1989 and shall govern all proceedings in criminal cases thereafter commenced and, insofar as just and practicable, all proceedings in criminal cases then pending.

3. That THE CHIEF JUSTICE be, and he hereby is, authorized to transmit to the Congress the foregoing amendments to the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure in accordance with the provisions of Section 2072 of Title 28, United States Code.

That the foregoing amendments to the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure shall take effect on September 1, 1953 and shall govern all proceedings in criminal cases thereafter commenced and, in criminal cases then pending, all proceedings in criminal cases then pending on or after the date by which the Court Justice be and they hereby are ordered to amend the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure in accordance with the provisions of Section 2072 of Title 28, United States Code, 28 U.S.C. 2072, in order to conform to the amendments.
