

SUPREME COURT OF THE UNITED STATES

ORDERED:

1. That the Bankruptcy Rules be, and they hereby are, amended by including therein an amendment to Bankruptcy Rule 9006(a) as hereinafter set forth:

2. That the foregoing change in the Bankruptcy Rules shall take effect on August 1, 1989 and shall govern all proceedings in bankruptcy cases thereafter commenced and, insofar as just and practicable, all proceedings in bankruptcy cases then pending.

3. That THE CHIEF JUSTICE be, and he hereby is, authorized to transmit to the Congress the foregoing amendment to the Bankruptcy Rules in accordance with the provisions of Section 2075 of Title 28, United States Code.

ORDER

1. That the Bankruptcy Rules be, and they hereby are, amended by including therein an amendment to Bankruptcy Rule 3000(a) as hereinafter set forth:

[1959-2, Stat. 1132.]

2. That the foregoing change in the Bankruptcy Rules shall take effect on August 1, 1959 and shall govern all proceedings in bankruptcy cases thereafter commenced and, in cases then pending, only as to matters arising in bankruptcy cases thereafter pending out to trial or to final order and judgment.

3. That the Executive Order defining the jurisdiction of the Federal bankruptcy courts be amended to conform to the amendments to the Bankruptcy Rules in accordance with the provisions of Section 3007 of Title 28, United States Code.

Section 3007 of Title 28, United States Code, containing the Advisory Committee Note submitted to the Court for its consideration is set forth in the Report of the Advisory Committee on the Proposed Amendments to the Bankruptcy Rules, United States Code, 1959.
