CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of Congress that the National Aeronautics and Space Administration should be commended for successfully carrying out the Mars Pathfinder Mission, and that the United States should continue to act as the leader in space exploration into the 21st century.

Whereas the National Aeronautics and Space Administration successfully landed the United States spacecraft Pathfinder on the surface of Mars on July 4, 1997;

Whereas through this extraordinary achievement the National Aeronautics and Space Administration will enhance

human knowledge of Mars and provide unique insights into the history and evolution of the Red Planet;

Whereas the National Aeronautics and Space Administration successfully followed its motto of “faster, better, cheaper” in landing the Pathfinder on the surface of Mars and in releasing the 23-pound Sojourner to independently travel, explore, and analyze samples of the Martian terrain through a focused set of science investigations; and

Whereas the National Aeronautics and Space Administration has reawakened the consciousness of the people of the United States to the unlimited potential of space exploration, including possible human expeditions to Mars and throughout the solar system: Now, therefore, be it
