Mr. SAXTON submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was referred to the Committee on International Relations

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the Congress that United States foreign policy with respect to the Middle East peace process should not include an attempt to require Israel to make concessions which Israel does not believe to be in its self-interest, including concessions which would jeopardize the security of Israel.

1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
2 *concurring)*, That it is the sense of the Congress that—
3 (1) United States foreign policy with respect to
4 the Middle East peace process should not include an
5 attempt to require Israel to make concessions which
6 Israel does not believe to be in its self-interest, in-

1 including concessions which would jeopardize the secu-
2 rity of Israel; and

3 (2) the role of the United States in such peace
4 process should be that of a facilitator in an attempt
5 to bring the parties to the peace process to a mutual
6 agreement as opposed to declaring the terms of the
7 agreement on a unilateral basis.
