## CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Stating the sense of Congress that any national missile defense program to provide protection for the United States against the threat of ballistic missile attack should provide for the protection of Alaska, Hawaii, and the territories and commonwealths of the United States on the same basis as the contiguous States.

- 1 *Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate*
- 2 *concurring), That it is the sense of Congress that—*

1           (1) any national missile defense program to  
2       provide protection for the United States against the  
3       threat of ballistic missile attack should be designed  
4       so as to provide for the protection of the States of  
5       Alaska and Hawaii and the territories and common-  
6       wealths of the United States on an equal basis with  
7       the contiguous States; and

8           (2) any National Intelligence Estimate prepared  
9       with respect to intercontinental ballistic missile ca-  
10      pabilities of foreign countries should include assess-  
11      ment of the ballistic missile threat to Alaska, Ha-  
12      waii, and the territories and commonwealths of the  
13      United States.
