- Whereas Bishop Frederic Baraga was a tireless champion of Native Americans;
- Whereas Bishop Frederic Baraga adamantly defended the right of the native people of Michigan to remain in their ancestral territory;
- Whereas Bishop Baraga focused primarily on literacy, writing, and the publishing of books in native languages;
- Whereas Bishop Baraga was a strong advocate of education;

Whereas issuing a postage stamp to honor the achievements made by Bishop Frederic Baraga is proper and fitting: Now, therefore, be it

- 1 Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate
- 2 concurring), That it is the sense of the Congress that—
- 3 (1) a postage stamp should be issued to honor
- 4 Bishop Frederic Baraga; and
- 5 (2) the Citizens' Stamp Advisory Committee of
- 6 the United States Postal Service should recommend
- 7 to the Postmaster General that such a postage
- 8 stamp is issued.
