CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the Congress that Federal civilian and military retirement cost-of-living adjustments should not be delayed.

Whereas, over the years, Federal employees and retirees and military personnel and retirees have regularly been forced to bear a disproportionate share in connection with deficit reduction; and

Whereas it would be inequitable to delay cost-of-living adjustments for Federal civilian and military retirees when like delays for other retirees are considered to be inappropriate: Now, therefore, be it

- 3 of-living adjustments for Federal civilian and military re-
- 4 tirees should be paid beginning in January of each year,
- 5 as current law prescribes, and should not be delayed,
- 6 whether as part of a budget agreement or otherwise.
