Mr. MANZULLO introduced the following joint resolution; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States prohibiting courts from levying or increasing taxes.

1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled (two-*
3 *thirds of each House concurring therein),* That the follow-
4 ing article is proposed as an amendment to the Constitu-
5 tion of the United States, which shall be valid to all intents
6 and purposes as part of the Constitution when ratified by
7 the legislatures of three-fourths of the several States with-
8 in seven years after the date of its submission for ratifica-
9 tion:

1 “ARTICLE —

2 “Neither the Supreme Court, nor any inferior court
3 of the United States, nor the court of any State in its
4 application of laws under this Constitution or any Federal
5 law, shall have the power to instruct or order a State or
6 political subdivision thereof, or an official of such State
7 or political subdivision, to levy or increase taxes.”.
