Mrs. Emerson introduced the following joint resolution; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States with respect to the right to life.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled
- 3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-
- 4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid only
- 6 when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the
- 7 several States within seven years after the date of final
- 8 passage of this joint resolution:

1	"ARTICLE —

- 2 "Section 1. With respect to the right to life, the
- 3 word 'person' as used in this article and in the fifth and
- 4 fourteenth articles of amendment applies to all human
- 5 beings irrespective of age, health, function, or condition
- 6 of dependency, including their unborn offspring at every
- 7 state of their biological development.
- 8 "Section 2. No unborn person shall be deprived of
- 9 life by any person: Provided, however, That nothing in this
- 10 article shall prohibit a law permitting only those medical
- 11 procedures required to prevent the death of the mother
- 12 of an unborn person: Provided further, That nothing in
- 13 this article shall limit the liberty of a mother with respect
- 14 to the unborn offspring of the mother conceived as a result
- 15 of rape or incest.
- 16 "Section 3. The Congress and the several States
- 17 shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate leg-
- 18 islation.".
