Mr. Goss introduced the following joint resolution; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to provide for four-year terms for Representatives and to limit the number of consecutive terms Senators and Representatives may serve.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled
- 3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-
- 4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
- 6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
- 7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several

- 1 States within seven years after the date of its submission
- 2 for ratification:
- 3 "Article —
- 4 "Section 1. The term of office of Representatives
- 5 in Congress shall be four years, and the election of Rep-
- 6 resentatives shall be held on the same day as the election
- 7 of the President. Representatives shall be limited to three
- 8 consecutive terms in office, and, after such terms, shall
- 9 be eligible for subsequent election after an absence from
- 10 the House of Representatives of four consecutive years.
- "Section 2. Senators shall be limited to two con-
- 12 secutive terms in office, and, after such terms, shall be
- 13 eligible for subsequent election after an absence from the
- 14 Senate of four consecutive years.
- 15 "Section 3. For purposes of this article, Represent-
- 16 atives who have served two years of a term, and Senators
- 17 who have served three years of a term, are deemed to have
- 18 served a full term.
- 19 "Section 4. This article shall apply to terms of of-
- 20 fice of Senators and Representatives beginning after the
- 21 date of ratification of this article.".
