JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States limiting the number of consecutive terms for Members of the House of Representatives and the Senate.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled
- 3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-
- 4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
- 6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
- 7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several

- 1 States within seven years after the date of its submission
- 2 by the Congress:
- 3 "Article—
- 4 "Section 1. A person may not serve any portion of
- 5 a term as a Representative if the person has served as
- 6 a Representative for more than one year of each of the
- 7 six terms that immediately precede the term.
- 8 "Section 2. A person may not serve any portion of
- 9 a term as a Senator if the person has served as a Senator
- 10 for more than three years of each of the two terms that
- 11 immediately precede the term.
- "Section 3. This article shall not prevent a person
- 13 who is serving any portion of a term as a Representative
- 14 or Senator on the date of the ratification of this article
- 15 from serving the remainder of the term.".
