## **JOINT RESOLUTION**

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States regarding the liability of Members of Congress for false statements made in carrying out their official duties.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled (two-
- 3 thirds of each House concurring therein), That the follow-
- 4 ing article is proposed as an amendment to the Constitu-
- 5 tion of the United States, which shall be valid to all intents
- 6 and purposes as part of the Constitution when ratified by

- 1 the legislatures of three-fourths of the several States with-
- 2 in seven years after the date of its submission for ratifica-
- 3 tion:
- 4 "Article—
- 5 "Section 1. Senators and Representatives may be
- 6 held liable for false statements or other false communica-
- 7 tions made in carrying out their official duties.
- 8 "Section 2. The Congress shall have power to en-
- 9 force this article by appropriate legislation.".
