JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States limiting the period of time United States Senators and Representatives may serve.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled
- 3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-
- 4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
- 6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
- 7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
- 8 States within seven years after the date of its submission
- 9 for ratification:

1	"ARTICLE —
2	"Section 1. No person may serve in Congress more
3	than 2 full terms as a Senator. No person may serve in
4	Congress more than 3 full terms as a Representative.
5	"Section 2. Service as a Senator or Representative
6	before this article takes effect shall not be taken into ac-
7	count in determining service under section 1"
