JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled
- 3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-
- 4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
- 6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
- 7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
- 8 States:
- 9 "Congressional Term Limits Amendment
- 10 "Section A. No person shall serve in the office of
- 11 United States Representative for more than three terms,

- 1 but upon ratification of the Congressional Term Limits
- 2 Amendment no person who has held the office of United
- 3 States Representative or who then holds the office shall
- 4 serve for more than two additional terms.
- 5 "Section B. No person shall serve in the office of
- 6 United States Senator for more than two terms, but upon
- 7 ratification of the Congressional Term Limits Amendment
- 8 no person who has held the office of United States Senator
- 9 or who then holds the office shall serve more than one
- 10 additional term.
- 11 "SECTION C. This article shall have no time limit
- 12 within which it must be ratified by the legislatures of
- 13 three-fourths of the several States.".
