## **JOINT RESOLUTION**

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States allowing an item veto in appropriations bills.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled
- 3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-
- 4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution, which shall be valid to all intents and purposes
- 6 as part of the Constitution when ratified by the legisla-
- 7 tures of three-fourths of the several States:
- 8 "Article—
- 9 "Section 1. The President shall have the power to
- 10 disapprove any appropriation or provision and approve any

- 1 other appropriation or provision in the same appropriation
- 2 bill. In such case he shall, in signing the bill, designate
- 3 the appropriations and provisions disapproved; and shall
- 4 return a copy of such appropriations and provisions, with
- 5 his objections, to the House in which the bill shall have
- 6 originated; and the same proceedings shall then be had
- 7 as in case of other bills disapproved by the President.
- 8 "Section 2. This article shall be inoperative unless
- 9 it shall have been ratified as an amendment to the Con-
- 10 stitution by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
- 11 States within seven years from the date of its submis-
- 12 sion.".
