JOINT RESOLUTION

- To direct the Secretary of the Interior to design and construct a permanent addition to the Franklin Delano Roosevelt Memorial in Washington, D.C., and for other purposes.
- Whereas President Franklin Delano Roosevelt, after contracting poliomyelitis, required the use of a wheelchair for mobility and lived with this condition while leading the United States through some of its most difficult times; and
- Whereas President Roosevelt's courage, leadership, and success should serve as an example and inspiration for all Americans: Now, therefore, be it

 - 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. ADDITION TO FRANKLIN DELANO ROOSEVELT

- 2 **MEMORIAL.**
- 3 (a) Plan.—The Secretary of the Interior (referred
- 4 to in this joint resolution as the "Secretary") shall plan
- 5 for the design and construction of an addition of a perma-
- 6 nent statue, bas-relief, or other similar structure to the
- 7 Franklin Delano Roosevelt Memorial in Washington, D.C.
- 8 (referred to in this joint resolution as the "Memorial"),
- 9 to provide recognition of the fact that President Roo-
- 10 sevelt's leadership in the struggle by the United States
- 11 for peace, well-being, and human dignity was provided
- 12 while the President used a wheelchair.
- 13 (b) Commission of Fine Arts.—The Secretary
- 14 shall obtain the approval of the Commission of Fine Arts
- 15 for the design plan created under subsection (a).
- 16 (c) Report.—As soon as practicable, the Secretary
- 17 shall report to Congress and the President on findings and
- 18 recommendations for the addition to the Memorial.
- 19 (d) Construction.—Beginning on the date that is
- 20 120 days after submission of the report to Congress under
- 21 subsection (c), using only private contributions, the Sec-
- 22 retary shall construct the addition according to the plan
- 23 created under subsection (a).
- 24 SEC. 2. POWERS OF THE SECRETARY.
- To carry out this joint resolution, the Secretary
- 26 may—

1 (1) hold hearings and organize contests; and
2 (2) request the assistance and advice of mem3 bers of the disability community, the Commission of
4 Fine Arts, and the National Capital Planning Com5 mission, and the Commissions shall render the as6 sistance and advice requested.

7 SEC. 3. COMMEMORATIVE WORKS ACT.

- 8 Compliance by the Secretary with this joint resolution
- 9 shall satisfy all requirements for establishing a commemo-
- 10 rative work under the Commemorative Works Act (40
- 11 U.S.C. 1001 et seq.)
- 12 SEC. 4. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.
- 13 There are authorized to be appropriated to carry out
- 14 this joint resolution such sums as may be necessary.
