A BILL

To amend the provisions of title 18, United States Code, placing restrictions on the sale of handguns to require a purchaser to reveal if the purchaser is the subject of a court order of protection.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Protective Order En-
5 forcement Act.”.

6 **SEC. 2. PROTECTION ORDER.**

7 Section 922(s)(3)(B) of title 18, United States Code,
8 is amended—

- 1 (1) by striking “and” at the end of clause (vi),
- 2 (2) by inserting “and” at the end of clause
- 3 (vii), and
- 4 (3) by inserting after clause (vii) the following:
- 5 “(viii) is not subject to a court order that
- 6 restrains such person from harassing, stalking,
- 7 or threatening an intimate partner of such per-
- 8 son or child of such intimate partner or person,
- 9 or engaging in any other conduct that would
- 10 place an intimate partner in reasonable fear of
- 11 bodily injury to the partner or child.”.
