A BILL

To reauthorize appropriations for the conservation of the Washington salmon fishery through the purchase of salmon fishing licenses and fishing vessels.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. REAUTHORIZATION OF PROGRAM FOR CONSERVATION OF WASHINGTON SALMON FISHERY THROUGH PURCHASE OF SALMON FISHING LICENSES AND VESSELS.

Section 134 of the Salmon and Steelhead Conservation and Enhancement Act of 1980 (16 U.S.C. 3335) is

(1) by striking "for the purposes of carrying
out the provisions of this part" and inserting "for
the purchase of salmon fishing licenses and fishing
vessels in accordance with this part";

- (2) by striking "1981" and inserting "1997"; and
- (3) by adding at the end the following new sentence: "Amounts appropriated under this section for a fiscal year after fiscal year 1997 may be used only for the purchase of a salmon fishing license or a fishing vessel, from a person that fished under the authority of the license or that used the vessel to fish for salmon, respectively, for 3 years of the 5-year period ending on the date of the purchase of the license.".
