A BILL

To eliminate automatic pay adjustments for Members of Congress.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. ELIMINATION OF AUTOMATIC PAY ADJUST
MENTS FOR MEMBERS OF CONGRESS.

Section 601(a) of the Legislative Reorganization Act

of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 31) is amended—

(1) by striking paragraph (2); and

(2) in paragraph (1)—

1	(A) by striking "(1) The" and inserting
2	"The";
3	(B) by redesignating subparagraphs (A)
4	through (C) as paragraphs (1) through (3), re-
5	spectively; and
6	(C) by striking ", as adjusted by para-
7	graph (2) of this subsection".
