To amend chapter 11 of title 31, United States Code, to require that each President's budget submission to Congress include a detailed plan to achieve a balanced Federal budget, and for other purposes.

## A BILL

To amend chapter 11 of title 31, United States Code, to require that each President's budget submission to Congress include a detailed plan to achieve a balanced Federal budget, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Balanced Budget Re-
- 5 quirement Act of 1996".

### 1 SEC. 2. PRESIDENT'S BUDGET.

- 2 Section 1105(a) of title 31, United States Code, is
- 3 amended by adding at the end the following new para-
- 4 graph:
- 5 "(32) Beginning with the budget submission for
- 6 fiscal year 1998, a detailed plan to achieve a bal-
- 7 anced budget by fiscal year 2002, and, for any budg-
- 8 et submission for any fiscal year after 2002, a de-
- 9 tailed plan for maintaining a balanced budget in
- that fiscal year and in each of the 4 fiscal years fol-
- lowing that year unless a joint resolution has been
- enacted declaring war or a national economic or na-
- tional security emergency, in which case the applica-
- tion of this requirement shall be suspended for any
- fiscal year during which such declaration is in ef-
- 16 fect.".

#### 17 SEC. 3. CONGRESSIONAL TREATMENT OF BUDGET SUBMIS-

- 18 SIONS.
- 19 Upon the submission by the President of a budget
- 20 for the United States Government to the Congress pursu-
- 21 ant to section 1105(a) of title 31, United States Code,
- 22 the Director of the Congressional Budget Office shall de-
- 23 termine and certify whether the balanced budget plan sub-
- 24 mitted pursuant to section 1105(a)(32) of that title does
- 25 achieve a balanced budget. The Director shall inform the

- 1 Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Presi-
- 2 dent Pro Tempore of the Senate of the results of the cer-
- 3 tification. If the budget is certified as not being in balance
- 4 pursuant to such plan, the Speaker of the House and
- 5 President Pro Tempore shall so notify the President by
- 6 written, joint communication not later than 7 calendar
- 7 days thereafter. The President may, not later than 15 cal-
- 8 endar days after receipt of such communication, submit
- 9 to the Congress a revised detailed plan to achieve a bal-
- 10 anced budget.

### 11 SEC. 4. POINT OF ORDER.

- 12 (a) Section 305 of the Congressional Budget Act of
- 13 1974 is amended by adding at the end the following new
- 14 subsection:
- 15 "(e) Point of Order.—
- 16 "(1) Beginning with fiscal year 1998, it shall
- 17 not be in order in the House of Representatives or
- the Senate to consider any concurrent resolution on
- 19 the budget that does not achieve a balanced budget
- 20 by fiscal year 2002; and beginning with fiscal year
- 21 2002 it shall not be in order to consider any concur-
- rent resolution on the budget that does not maintain
- a balanced budget for that fiscal year and for each
- of the 4 fiscal years after that fiscal year.

- "(2) Paragraph (1) may not be waived by rule or order of either House of Congress unless a joint resolution has been enacted declaring war or a national economic or national security emergency, in which case the application of that paragraph shall be suspended for any fiscal year during which such declaration is in effect.".
- 8 SEC. 5. CONSIDERATION OF PRESIDENTS' BUDGETS IN THE
- 9 HOUSE AND SENATE.
- 10 (a) House of Representatives.—Section 305(a)
- 11 of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974 is amended by
- 12 adding at the end the following new paragraph:
- "(8) It shall be in order in the House of Rep-
- resentatives to consider any amendment to a concur-
- rent resolution on the budget for a fiscal year re-
- 16 flecting, without substantive change, the budget sub-
- mitted by the President for that fiscal year and, if
- different, a separate amendment reflecting the de-
- tailed plan to achieve a balanced budget submitted
- by the President pursuant to section 1105(a)(32) of
- 21 title 31, United States Code.".
- 22 (b) Senate.—Section 305(b) of the Congressional
- 23 Budget Act of 1974 is amended by adding at the end the
- 24 following new paragraph:

"(7) It shall be in order in the Senate to consider any amendment to a concurrent resolution on the budget for a fiscal year reflecting, without substantive change, the budget submitted by the President for that fiscal year and, if different, a separate amendment reflecting the detailed plan to achieve a balanced budget submitted by the President pursuant to section 1105(a)(32) of title 31, United States Code.".
