A BILL

To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to permanently extend the orphan drug credit.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. ORPHAN DRUG CREDIT MADE PERMANENT.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 45C of the Internal Reve-
5 nue Code of 1986 (relating to clinical testing expenses for
6 certain drugs for rare diseases or conditions) is amended
7 by striking subsection (e).

1 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendment made by
2 subsection (a) shall apply to amounts paid or incurred
3 after May 31, 1997.

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
