AN ACT

To provide for the collection of data on traffic stops.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may b	e cited as the	e "Traffic Ste	ops Statistics

- 3 Study Act of 1998".
- 4 SEC. 2. ATTORNEY GENERAL TO COLLECT.
- 5 The Attorney General shall conduct a study of stops
- 6 for routine traffic violations by law enforcement officers.
- 7 Such study shall include collection and analysis of appro-
- 8 priate available data. The study shall include consideration
- 9 of the following factors, among others:
- 10 (1) The number of individuals stopped for rou-
- 11 tine traffic violations.
- 12 (2) Identifying characteristics of the individual 13 stopped, including the race and or ethnicity as well
- as the approximate age of that individual.
- 15 (3) The traffic infraction alleged to have been committed that led to the stop.
- 17 (4) Whether a search was instituted as a result 18 of the stop.
- 19 (5) How the search was instituted.
- 20 (6) The rationale for the search.
- 21 (7) Whether any contraband was discovered in 22 the course of the search.
- 23 (8) The nature of such contraband.
- 24 (9) Whether any warning or citation was issued 25 as a result of the stop.

- 1 (10) Whether an arrest was made as a result 2 of either the stop or the search.
- 3 (11) The benefit of traffic stops with regard to
- 4 the interdiction of drugs and the proceeds of drug
- 5 trafficking, including the approximate quantity of
- 6 drugs and value of drug proceeds seized on an an-
- 7 nual basis as a result of routine traffic stops.

8 SEC. 3. LIMITATION ON USE OF DATA.

- 9 Data acquired under this section shall be used only
- 10 for research or statistical purposes and may not contain
- 11 any information that may reveal the identity of any indi-
- 12 vidual who is stopped or any law enforcement officer. Data
- 13 acquired under this section shall not be used in any legal
- 14 or administrative proceeding to establish an inference of
- 15 discrimination on the basis of particular identifying char-
- 16 acteristics.

17 SEC. 4. RESULTS OF STUDY.

- Not later than 2 years after the date of the enact-
- 19 ment of this Act, the Attorney General shall report the
- 20 results of the study conducted under this Act to Congress.
