- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Medical Marijuana De-
- 5 terrence Act of 1997".

1 SEC. 2. DENIAL OF FEDERAL BENEFITS TO PERSONS CON-

- 2 VICTED OF CERTAIN DRUG OFFENSES.
- 3 Section 421 of the Controlled Substances Act (21
- 4 U.S.C. 862) is amended by adding at the end the follow-
- 5 ing:
- 6 "(i) Special Rule for Convictions in Certain
- 7 STATES.—In any State in which it is not unlawful under
- 8 State law for a person to use marijuana for medicinal pur-
- 9 poses, an individual who is convicted of a State offense
- 10 after the date of the enactment of this subsection shall
- 11 be ineligible for benefits as provided in subsection (a) or
- 12 (b) without regard to any discretion of the court.".
