A BILL

To amend the Federal Water Pollution Control Act to authorize a estrogenic substances screening program.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 That title III of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act
- 4 (33 U.S.C. 1311–1330) is amended by adding at the end
- 5 the following:

1 "SEC. 321. ESTROGENIC SUBSTANCES SCREENING PRO-

- 2 GRAM.
- 3 "In addition to the substances referred to in section
- 4 408(p)(3)(B) of the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic
- 5 Act (21 U.S.C. 346a(p)(3)(B)) or in section 1457 of the
- 6 title XIV of the Public Health Service Act (the Safe
- 7 Drinking Water Act)(42 U.S.C. 300j-17), the Adminis-
- 8 trator may provide for testing under the screening pro-
- 9 gram authorized by section 408(p) of the Federal Food,
- 10 Drug, and Cosmetic Act, in accordance with the provisions
- 11 of section 408(p) of such Act, of any other substance that
- 12 may be found in discharges of pollutants into navigable
- 13 waters if the Administrator determines that a substantial
- 14 population may be exposed to such substance.".
