- 3 SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF THE SUPPLEMENTAL SECURITY
- 4 INCOME BENEFITS PROGRAM TO GUAM AND
- 5 THE UNITED STATES VIRGIN ISLANDS.
- 6 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1101(a)(1) of the Social
- 7 Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1301(a)(1)) is amended by strik-
- 8 ing ", the Virgin Islands, and Guam" each place such
- 9 term appears.
- 10 (b) Conforming Amendments.—

- 1 (1) Section 303(b) of the Social Security 2 Amendments of 1972 (86 Stat. 1484) is amended by 3 striking ", Guam, and the Virgin Islands".
- 4 (2) Sections 3(a)(2), 1003(a)(2), 1403(a)(2),
  5 and 1603(a)(2) of such Act (42 U.S.C. 303(a)(2),
  6 1203(a)(2), 1353(a)(2), and 1383 note) are each
  7 amended by striking ", the Virgin Islands, and
  8 Guam".
- 9 (3) Section 1614(e) of such Act (42 U.S.C. 10 1382c(e)) is amended by striking "and the District 11 of Columbia" and inserting ", the District of Colum-12 bia, the Virgin Islands, and Guam".
- 13 (c) Effective Date.—The amendments made by 14 this section shall take effect on the 1st day of the 3rd 15 calendar month that begins after the date of the enact-16 ment of this Act.
