To amend the National Trails System Act to designate the Lincoln National Historic Trail as a component of the National Trails System.

- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. DESIGNATION.
- 4 Section 5(a) of the National Trails System Act (16
- 5 U.S.C. 1244(a)) is amended by adding the following new
- 6 paragraph at the end thereof:
- 7 "() The Lincoln National Historic Trail, a
- 8 trail of approximately 350 miles extending from
- 9 Lake Michigan to the Mississippi River, as generally
- described in 'The Proposal' in the Department of

- the Interior report entitled 'Illinois Trail, National Trail Feasibility Study and Environmental Assessment', dated September 1987, with an extension of
- 4 the water route down the Mississippi River to con-
- 5 nect with the Lewis and Clark National Historic
- 6 Trail near Wood River, Illinois. A map generally de-
- 7 picting the route shall be on file and available for
- 8 public inspection in the Office of the Director of the
- 9 National Park Service, Washington, District of Co-
- 10 lumbia. The trail shall be administered by the Sec-
- 11 retary of the Interior.".
- 12 SEC. 2. STUDY TRAIL.
- 13 Section 5(c) of the National Trails System Act (16
- 14 U.S.C. 1244(c)) is amended by adding the following new
- 15 paragraph at the end thereof:
- 16 "() An extension of the water route Lincoln
- 17 National Historic Trail, down the Sangamon River
- from Beardstown to Springfield.".
