A BILL

- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. WITHDRAWAL OF MOST FAVORED NATION STA-2 TUS FROM IRAN, IRAQ, LIBYA, AND SYRIA. 3 (a) WITHDRAWAL OF MFN STATUS.—Except as pro-4 vided in subsection (b), nondiscriminatory treatment shall 5 not apply with respect to any goods that— 6 (1) are the product of Iran, Iraq, Libya, or 7 Syria; and 8 (2) are entered into the customs territory of the 9 United States on or after the 15th day after the 10 date of the enactment of this Act. 11 (b) RESTORATION OF NONDISCRIMINATORY TREAT-MENT WITH RESPECT TO SYRIA.—Notwithstanding sub-12 section (a), the President may restore nondiscriminatory 13 treatment to goods that are the product of Syria 30 days after the President certifies to the Congress that the Gov-15 ernment of Syria is participating in the Middle East peace
