5       (a) ADMISSION OF NONIMMIGRANTS.—

6           (1) IN GENERAL.—Section 214 of the Immigra-  
7       tion and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1184) is amend-  
8       ed by striking subsection (l) (as added by section

2       grant Responsibility Act of 1996 (Public Law 104–

4           (2)     CONFORMING     AMENDMENT.—Section  
5       101(a)(15)(F) of the Immigration and Nationality  
6       Act (8 U.S.C. 1101(a)(15)(F)) is amended by strik-  
7       ing “consistent with section 214(l)” after “such a  
8       course of study”.

9       (b)     CLASSES OF EXCLUDABLE ALIENS.—Section  
10      212(a)(6) of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8  
11      U.S.C. 1182(a)(6)) is amended by striking subparagraph  
12      (G) (as added by section 346 of the Illegal Immigration  
13      Reform and Immigrant Responsibility Act of 1996 (Public  
14      Law 104–208; 110 Stat. 3009–638)).

15      (c)     EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by  
16      subsections (a) and (b) shall take effect as if included in  
17      the enactment of the Illegal Immigration Reform and Im-  
18      migrant Responsibility Act of 1996 (Public Law 104–208;  
19      110 Stat. 3009–546).
