## A BILL

To provide that pay for Members of Congress may not be increased by any adjustment scheduled to take effect in a year immediately following a fiscal year in which a deficit in the budget of the United States Government exists.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. CONDITION.
- 4 (a) In General.—Section 601(a) of the Legislative
- 5 Reorganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 31) is amended—

1 (1) in paragraph (2)(A) by striking "Subject to 2 subparagraph (B)," and inserting "Subject to subparagraph (B) and paragraph (3),"; and 3 (2) by adding at the end the following: 5 "(3)(A) An adjustment under paragraph (2) which is scheduled to take effect in a calendar year shall not be made if the budget of the United States Government 8 was in deficit for the last fiscal year ending before the start of such calendar year, as determined under subpara-10 graph (B). 11 "(B) Not later than 2 months after the end of each 12 fiscal year, the Director of the Congressional Budget Of-13 fice shall— "(i) determine whether the budget of the Unit-14 15 ed States Government was in deficit for such fiscal 16 year; and 17 "(ii) submit a written report to the Congress as 18 to its findings under this subparagraph. 19 A failure to make a timely determination under the preceding sentence shall be treated as a determination under 20 21 this subparagraph that the budget of the United States

Government was in deficit for the fiscal year involved.".

3 scheduled to take effect after December 31, 1998.
