To prohibit fundraising at the White House and elsewhere.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Presidential Fundrais-
- 5 ing Integrity Act of 1997".
- 6 SEC. 2. PROHIBITION OF FUNDRAISING AT THE WHITE
- 7 HOUSE AND ELSEWHERE.
- 8 (a) Prohibition.—Whoever, on the grounds or in
- 9 the buildings, including private residential areas, of an of-
- 10 ficial residence or retreat of the President or Vice Presi-
- 11 dent, solicits, receives, or rewards a political contribution

- 1 shall be fined under title 18, United States Code, or im-
- 2 prisoned not more than three years, or both.
- 3 (b) Definitions.—For purposes of subsection (a):
- 4 (1) GROUNDS.—The term "grounds" means all areas of an official residence or retreat of the President or Vice President that are routinely protected by, or to which access is routinely controlled by, the United States Secret Service.
 - (2) Political contribution.—The term "political contribution" means an offering of money, property, or services to or for the benefit of an announced or unannounced political candidate, or a political party, or an organization promoting an announced or unannounced political candidate, or a political party.
