## A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to protect the sanctity of religious communications.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Religious Communica-
- 5 tion Sanctity Act of 1997".
- 6 SEC. 2. PROTECTION OF SANCTITY OF RELIGIOUS COMMU-
- 7 NICATIONS.
- 8 (a) In General.—Chapter 13 of title 18, United
- 9 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the follow-
- 10 ing:

## 1 "§ 249. Protection of sanctity of religious communica-

- 2 tions
- 3 "(a) Whoever, under color of governmental authority,
- 4 surreptitiously listens to or records in any manner, any
- 5 communication that is privileged, because of its religious
- 6 character, under Federal law or under the non-Federal
- 7 law of the place where such communication takes place,
- 8 shall be fined under this title or imprisoned not more than
- 9 5 years, or both.
- 10 "(b) Any person aggrieved by a violation of this sec-
- 11 tion consisting of the recording of a communication may,
- 12 in a civil action, obtain the prompt destruction of that re-
- 13 cording and any copies or transcripts made from that re-
- 14 cording.".
- 15 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
- 16 at the beginning of chapter 13 of title 18, United States
- 17 Code, is amended by adding at the end the following new
- 18 item:

"249. Protection of sanctity of religious communications.".
