A BILL

- To withhold United States assistance for programs or projects of the International Atomic Energy Agency in Cuba, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "International Atomic
 - 5 Energy Agency (IAEA) Accountability and Safety Act of
 - 6 1997".

1	SEC. 2. WITHHOLDING OF PROPORTIONAL SHARE OF AS-
2	SISTANCE FOR CERTAIN PROGRAMS OR
3	PROJECTS OF THE INTERNATIONAL ATOMIC
4	ENERGY AGENCY IN CUBA.
5	(a) In General.—Section 307(c) of the Foreign As-
6	sistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2227(e)) is amended—
7	(1) by striking "The limitations" and inserting
8	"(1) Subject to paragraph (2), the limitations"; and
9	(2) by adding at the end the following:
10	"(2)(A) Except as provided in subparagraph (B),
11	with respect to funds authorized to be appropriated by this
12	chapter and available for the International Atomic Energy
13	Agency, the limitations of subsection (a) shall apply to

25	"(I) ratifies the Treaty on the Non-Prolifera-
