Mr. MENENDEZ (for himself, Mr. DIAZ-BALART, Mr. GILMAN, Ms. ROS-LEHTINEN, and Mr. DEUTSCH) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on International Relations

A BILL

To withhold United States assistance for programs or projects of the International Atomic Energy Agency in Cuba, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “International Atomic
5 Energy Agency (IAEA) Accountability and Safety Act of
6 1997”.

1 **SEC. 2. WITHHOLDING OF PROPORTIONAL SHARE OF AS-**
2 **SISTANCE FOR CERTAIN PROGRAMS OR**
3 **PROJECTS OF THE INTERNATIONAL ATOMIC**
4 **ENERGY AGENCY IN CUBA.**

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 307(c) of the Foreign As-
6 sistance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2227(c)) is amended—

7 (1) by striking “The limitations” and inserting

8 “(1) Subject to paragraph (2), the limitations”; and

9 (2) by adding at the end the following:

10 “(2)(A) Except as provided in subparagraph (B),
11 with respect to funds authorized to be appropriated by this
12 chapter and available for the International Atomic Energy
13 Agency, the limitations of subsection (a) shall apply to
14 programs or projects of such Agency in Cuba.

15 “(B)(i) Subparagraph (A) shall not apply with re-
16 spect to programs or projects of the International Atomic
17 Energy Agency that provide for the discontinuation, dis-
18 mantling, or safety inspection of nuclear facilities or relat-
19 ed materials, or for inspections and similar activities de-
20 signed to prevent the development of nuclear weapons by
21 a country described in subsection (a).

22 “(ii) Clause (i) shall not apply with respect to the
23 Juragua Nuclear Power Plant near Cienfuegos, Cuba, or
24 the Pedro Pi Nuclear Research Center unless Cuba—

25 “(I) ratifies the Treaty on the Non-Prolifera-
26 tion of Nuclear Weapons (21 UST 483) or the Trea-

1 ty for the Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons in Latin
2 America (commonly known as the Treaty of
3 Tlatelolco);

4 “(II) negotiates full-scope safeguards of the
5 International Atomic Energy Agency not later than
6 two years after ratification by Cuba of such Treaty;
7 and

8 “(III) incorporates internationally accepted nu-
9 clear safety standards.”.

10 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
11 subsection (a) shall take effect on October 1, 1997, or the
12 date of the enactment of this Act, whichever occurs later.

13 **SEC. 3. OPPOSITION TO CERTAIN PROGRAMS OR PROJECTS**
14 **OF THE INTERNATIONAL ATOMIC ENERGY**
15 **AGENCY IN CUBA.**

16 The Secretary of State shall direct the United States
17 representative to the International Atomic Energy Agency
18 to oppose the following:

19 (1) Technical assistance programs or projects of
20 the Agency at the Juragua Nuclear Power Plant
21 near Cienfuegos, Cuba, and at the Pedro Pi Nuclear
22 Research Center.

23 (2) Any other program or project of the Agency
24 in Cuba that is, or could become, a threat to the se-
25 curity of the United States.

1 **SEC. 4. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS.**

2 (a) REQUEST FOR IAEA REPORTS.—The Secretary
3 of State shall direct the United States representative to
4 the International Atomic Energy Agency to request the
5 Director-General of the Agency to submit to the United
6 States all reports prepared with respect to all programs
7 or projects of the Agency that are of concern to the United
8 States, including the programs or projects described in
9 section 3.

10 (b) ANNUAL REPORTS TO CONGRESS.—Not later
11 than 180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act,
12 and on an annual basis thereafter, the Secretary of State,
13 in consultation with the United States representative to
14 the International Atomic Energy Agency, shall prepare
15 and submit to the Congress a report containing a descrip-
16 tion of all programs or projects of the Agency in each
17 country described in section 307(a) of the Foreign Assist-
18 ance Act of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2227(a)).

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
