Mr. Vento introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Resources

A BILL

To enhance the conservation and protection of the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "BWCA Wilderness
- 5 Legacy Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.
- 7 The Congress finds that:
- 8 (1) The Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilder-
- 9 ness is a special natural resource that offers a

- unique lakeland experience for the enjoyment and inspiration of present and future generations.
 - (2) The Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness is an international, national, and Minnesota treasure worthy of national preservation and protection as a wilderness area.
 - (3) Congress has expressed overwhelming support for the protection of this resource through its designation as a wilderness area and by providing sustained funding to protect and responsibly manage this national treasure.
 - (4) Public acceptance and enthusiasm for the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness has established the area as the most widely used wilderness unit in the entire national wilderness preservation system.
 - (5) The overwhelming majority of Minnesotans support greater wilderness protections for the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness.
 - (6) It is necessary and desirable to further provide for the orderly administration and management of public use and enjoyment of this national wilderness while at the same time protecting the special qualities of the area as a natural forest-lakeland wilderness ecosystem of major esthetic, cultural, sci-

3	SEC. 3. BOUNDARY WATERS CANOE AREA WILDERNESS
4	DESIGNATION.
5	Section 3 of Public Law 94–495 (16 U.S.C. 1132
6	note) is amended as follows:
7	(1) By amending the first sentence to read as
8	follows: "The areas generally depicted as wilderness
9	on the map entitled 'Boundary Waters Canoe Area
10	Wilderness' and dated 1997, comprising approxi-
11	mately 1,094,370 acres, are hereby designated as
12	the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness (here-
13	inafter referred to as the 'Wilderness').".
14	(2) By striking "one year after the date of en-
15	actment of this Act" and inserting "one year after
16	the enactment of the BWCA Wilderness Legacy
17	Act''.
18	(3) By amending the third sentence to read as
19	follows: "Such map and description shall be filed
20	with the Committee on Resources of the United
21	States House of Representatives and the Committee
22	on Energy and Natural Resources of the United

States Senate.".

1 SEC. 4. AMENDMENTS TO SECTION 4 OF PUBLIC LAW 95-495.

- 2 Section 4 of Public Law 95–495 (16 U.S.C. 1132
- 3 note) is amended as follows:
- 4 (1) In subsection (c)(2) by striking "Sea Gull,
- 5 that portion generally east of Threemile Island,
- 6 Cook County;".
- 7 (2) In subsection (c)(3) by striking "that por-
- 8 tion generally west of Threemile Island,".
- 9 (3) In subsection (d) by striking "Loon Lake,
- 10 Saint Louis County; that portion of the Lac La
- 11 Croix, Saint Louis County, south of Snow Bay and
- east of Wilkins Bay.".
- 13 (4) By adding the following new subsection
- 14 after subsection (i):
- 15 "(j) Effective on January 1, 1998, the Secretary shall
- 16 terminate all special use permits for towboats; from that
- 17 date forward, use of towboats within the wilderness shall
- 18 be prohibited, whether for commercial or noncommercial
- 19 purposes.".

20 SEC. 5. AIRSPACE RESERVATION.

- The provisions of Executive Order 10092 shall be ap-
- 22 plicable to the areas depicted as wilderness on the map
- 23 referred to in the amendments made by section 3 of this
- 24 Act.
