## A BILL

To authorize continuation of a nationwide permit for discharges of dredged or fill materials into headwaters and isolated waters, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION. 1. RULE TO CONTINUE WITHOUT MODIFICATION;
- 4 MULTIPLE PERMITS ALLOWED.
- 5 (a) Rule to Continue.—Part 330 of title 33, Code
- 6 of Federal Regulations, including appendix A of such part,
- 7 shall continue as in effect on December 12, 1996, without
- 8 expiration notwithstanding section 404 of the Federal
- 9 Water Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C. 1344(e)(2)), to
- 10 the extent that such rules relate to nationwide permit 26.

- 1 (b) Rule To Have No Force or Effect.—The
- 2 rule published in the Federal Register on December 13,
- 3 1996 (61 Fed. Reg. 65874 through 65922), shall have no
- 4 force or effect to the extent that such rule purports to
- 5 relate to nationwide permit 26.
- 6 (c) Modification Prohibited.—The Secretary of
- 7 the Army shall not issue any rule which modifies or re-
- 8 scinds part 330 of title 33, Code of Federal Regulations,
- 9 including appendix A of such part, as it relates to nation-
- 10 wide permit 26. Any rule issued in violation of this sub-
- 11 section shall have no force or effect as to nationwide per-
- 12 mit 26.
- 13 (d) Multiple Permits Allowed.—Permits issued
- 14 under nationwide permit 26, as described in subsection
- 15 (a), may be combined and issued in conjunction with other
- 16 general permits to the extent that such multiple general
- 17 permits do not cause more than minimal adverse effects
- 18 to the environment. Activities that do not qualify for ap-
- 19 proval under nationwide permit 26, as provided in sub-
- 20 section (a), may be authorized by one or more other gen-
- 21 eral permits.
- 22 (e) Definitions.—For the purposes of this section,
- 23 any term not expressly defined in this Act shall have the

- 1 meaning given that term in regulations issued by the Sec-
- 2 retary of the Army.
