 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Freedom From Union
 - 5 Violence Act of 1997".
 - 6 SEC. 2. CLARIFICATION OF COVERAGE OF THE HOBBS ACT.
 - 7 Section 1951 of title 18, United States Code, is
 - 8 amended by adding at the end the following:

1	"(d) For the purposes of this section, the use of ac-
2	tual or threatened force, violence, or fear in order to
3	achieve an otherwise legitimate labor relations objective,
4	other than that use which—
5	"(1) is incidental to otherwise peaceful picket-
6	ing during a labor dispute;
7	"(2) consists solely of minor bodily injury, or
8	minor damage to property, or threat or fear of such
9	minor injury or damage; and
10	"(3) is not a part of a pattern of violent con-
11	duct or of coordinated violent activity;
