- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. CHLOROFLUOROCARBONS IN METERED-DOSE
- 4 INHALERS.
- 5 The Secretary of Health and Human Services shall
- 6 take no action to promulgate a final rule on the basis of
- 7 the proposed regulation of the Food and Drug Administra-
- 8 tion (62 Fed. Reg. 10242) to designate the use of

- 1 chlorofluorocarbons (CFC) in metered-dose inhalers
- 2 (MDI) as nonessential so as to make MDI's which use
- 3 CFC an adulterated device. The Secretary shall focus ef-
- 4 forts on implementing existing Montreal Protocol decisions
- 5 that will facilitate a transition to CFC-free by the year

6 2005.
