A BILL

To direct the Secretary of the Army to convey lands acquired for the Sallisaw Creek project, Sequoyah County, Oklahoma.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. LAND CONVEYANCES.
- 4 (a) In General.—The Secretary of the Army,
- 5 through the Real Estate Division of the Tulsa District,
- 6 United States Army Corps of Engineers, shall convey all
- 7 right, title, and interest of the United States in and to
- 8 land acquired by the United States for the Sallisaw Creek
- 9 project in Sequoyah County, Oklahoma, in accordance
- 10 with this Act.

1	(b) Qualified Previous Owners of Land.—
2	(1) In General.—The Secretary shall give
3	qualified previous owners of land first option to pur-
4	chase the land which they previously owned.
5	(2) Application.—
6	(A) In general.—To be eligible to pur-
7	chase land under this subsection, a qualified
8	previous owner of land shall file an application
9	to purchase such land with the Secretary not
10	later than 180 days after receiving notice pur-
11	suant to section 2.
12	(B) First to file has first option.—
13	If more than one application is filed for a parcel
14	of land, the first option to purchase such parcel
15	of land shall be allotted in the order in which
16	the applications for such parcel of land were
17	filed.
18	(3) Identification of previous owners.—
19	As soon as practicable after the date of the enact-
20	ment of this Act, the Secretary shall, to the extent
21	practicable, identify each previous owner of land.
22	(4) Consideration.—Consideration for land
23	conveyed under this subsection shall be the fair mar-

ket value of that land.

1	(c) Public Auction.—Any parcel of land for which
2	an application has not been filed pursuant to subsection
3	(b)(2) within the applicable time period shall be sold at
4	public auction.
5	SEC. 2. NOTICE.
6	(a) In General.—The Secretary shall notify—
7	(1) each individual identified as a previous
8	owner of land pursuant to section 1(b)(3), not later
9	than 30 days after identification, by United States
10	mail; and
11	(2) the general public, not later than 30 days
12	after the date of the enactment of this Act, by publi-
13	cation in the Federal Register.
14	(b) CONTENT OF NOTICE.—Notice under this section
15	shall include—
16	(1) a copy of the provisions of this Act;
17	(2) information sufficient to separately identify
18	each parcel of land subject to this Act; and
19	(3) the fair market value of each parcel of land
20	subject to this Act.
21	(c) Official Date of Notice.—The official date
22	of notice under this section shall be the later of—
23	(1) the date upon which actual notice is mailed;
24	or

1	(2) the date of publication of the notice in the
2	Federal Register.

3 SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.

- 4 In this Act, the following definitions apply:
 - (1) Fair Market value.—The term "fair market value" means the amount for which a willing buyer would purchase and a willing seller would sell such land, as determined by a qualified, independent land appraiser.
 - (2) Previous owner of Land.—The term "previous owner of land" means a person who conveyed, and in the case of an individual, a person whose parent conveyed, such land to the United States for use in the Sallisaw Creek project in Sequoyah County, Oklahoma.
 - (3) QUALIFIED PREVIOUS OWNER OF LAND.—
 The term "qualified previous owner of land" means a previous owner of land who demonstrates a willingness and ability to pay fair market value for the land which was previously owned.
 - (4) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means the Secretary of the Army.
