## A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, to prohibit desecration of Veterans' memorials.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Veterans' Memorials
- 5 Protection Act of 1997".
- 6 SEC. 2. DESECRATION OF VETERANS' MEMORIALS.
- 7 (a) In General.—Chapter 65 of title 18, United
- 8 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the follow-
- 9 ing:

#### 1 "§ 1368. Desecration of veterans' memorials

- 2 "(a) Whoever, in a circumstance described in sub-
- 3 section (b), willfully injures or commits any depredation
- 4 against any structure, plaque, statue, or other monument
- 5 on public property commemorating the service of any per-
- 6 son or persons in the armed forces of the United States,
- 7 shall be fined under this title or imprisoned not more than
- 8 10 years, or both, but if the damage or attempted damage
- 9 does not exceed the sum of \$1000, the defendant shall
- 10 be fined under this title or imprisoned not more than one
- 11 year, or both.
- 12 "(b) The circumstance referred to in subsection (a)
- 13 is that in committing the offense, the defendant travels
- 14 or causes another to travel in interstate or foreign com-
- 15 merce, or uses the mail or an instrumentality of interstate
- 16 or foreign commerce.".
- 17 (b) Clerical Amendment.—The table of sections
- 18 at the beginning of chapter 65 of title 18, United States
- 19 Code, is amended by adding at the end the following:

"1368. Desecration of veterans' memorials.".
