1 SECTION 1. PARENT EDUCATION SYSTEM.

2 Section 30201(a)(2) of the Violent Crime Control and 3 Law Enforcement Act of 1994 is amended by adding at 4 the end the following: "(O) Voluntary, comprehensive, and cul-5 turally-appropriate home visitor systems that 6 7 provide parenting education that focuses on 8 parenting skills, child development, child health, and support services for new parents to prevent 9 10 or decrease the risk of child abuse. To avoid duplication of services, a system developed pursu-11 12 ant to this paragraph shall be coordinated with 13 other organizations that provide services to children, particularly infants.". 14
