2	cept as provided in subparagraph (C)," after "(ii)";

4	(2) by adding at the end the following:
5	"(C) EXCEPTION FOR ADOPTED CHIL-
6	DREN.—Subparagraph (A)(ii) shall not apply to
7	a child who is—
8	"(i) described in section 101(b)(1)(F);
9	"(ii) seeking an immigrant visa as an
10	immediate relative under section 201(b);

12	"(iii) 10 years of age or younger at
13	the time a petition is filed in the child's be-
