Mr. GILMAN (for himself and Mr. RANGEL) introduced the following bill;
which was referred to the Committee on Commerce

A BILL

To provide for a waiver for the State of New York of certain health care provider tax provisions under Medicaid.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That, notwithstanding any other provision of law, taxes,
4 fees, or assessments, as defined in section 1903(w)(3)(A)
5 of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1396b(w)(3)(A)),
6 that were collected by the State of New York from a health
7 care provider before June 1, 1997, and for which a waiver
8 of the provisions of subparagraph (B) or (C) of section
9 1903(w)(3) of such Act has been applied for, or that
10 would, but for this Act require that such a waiver be ap-

1 plied for, in accordance with subparagraph (E) of such
2 section, and, (if so applied for) upon which action by the
3 Secretary of Health and Human Services (including any
4 judicial review of any such proceeding) has not been com-
5 pleted as of July 23, 1997, are deemed to be permissible
6 health care related taxes and in compliance with the re-
7 quirements of subparagraphs (B) and (C) of section
8 1903(w)(3) of such Act.
