A BILL

To prevent Members of Congress from receiving any automatic pay adjustment which might otherwise take effect in 1998.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. NO AUTOMATIC PAY ADJUSTMENT.
- 4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The rate of pay for each office
- 5 or position referred to in section 601(a)(1) of the Legisla-
- 6 tive Reorganization Act of 1946 (2 U.S.C. 31(1))—
- 7 (1) shall not be increased by reason of any ad-
- 8 justment which, but for this section, would otherwise

- take effect under section 601(a)(2) of such Act in
 1998; or
- (2) if so increased before this Act becomes law,
 shall be restored, as of the date of enactment of this
 Act, to the rate of pay which was in effect for such
 office or position immediately before such date of enactment.
- 8 (b) Specific Reference Requirement.—Sub-9 section (a) shall not be superseded except by a provision 10 of law that specifically repeals, modifies, or supersedes 11 such subsection.
