1	SECTION 1. EXEMPTION OF CERTAIN INDIVIDUALS FROM
2	CHANGES MADE BY THE OMNIBUS BUDGET
3	RECONCILIATION ACT OF 1993 IN THE MEDI-
4	CARE SECONDARY PAYER RULES FOR INDI-
5	VIDUALS WITH END STAGE RENAL DISEASE.
6	Effective as of the date of the enactment of the Omni-
7	bus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1993 (Public Law 103–
8	66), the amendments made by paragraphs (2) and (3) of
9	section 13561(c) of such Act (107 Stat. 593) shall not
10	apply to an individual who—
11	(1) was 65 years of age or older as of the date
12	of the enactment of such Act,
13	(2) was eligible for benefits under part A of
14	title XVIII of the Social Security Act under section
15	226(a) of such Act (42 U.S.C. 426(a)) before the in-
16	dividual is determined to have end stage renal dis-
17	ease, and
18	(3) applies to the Secretary of Health and
19	Human Services for treatment under this section
20	within 90 days after the date of the enactment of
21	this Act.
22	The Secretary of Health and Human Services shall pro-
23	vide for such retrospective payment adjustments to such
24	individuals, and to their insurers and health care provid-
25	ers as may be necessary to carry out this section
