- 5 Section 10 of the Agricultural Adjustment Act (7
- 6 U.S.C. 610), reenacted with amendments by the Agricul-
- 7 tural Marketing Agreement Act of 1937, is amended by
- 8 adding at the end the following:

- 1 "(k) No action, regulation, decision, determination,
- 2 or other act or omission of any individual acting on behalf
- 3 of, or under the authority of, the Secretary of Agriculture
- 4 with respect to an agricultural marketing order or agree-
- 5 ment issued under the authority of section 8c or another
- 6 provision of law shall be construed to be within the prohi-
- 7 bitions of the antitrust laws of the United States.".

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
