A BILL

To provide additional compensation for members of the Metropolitan Police Department and Fire Department of the District of Columbia, the United States Secret Service Uniformed Division, and the United States Park Police who carry out certain technical or hazardous duties, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

1	SECTION 1. ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION FOR DISTRICT OF
2	COLUMBIA OFFICERS CARRYING OUT CER-
3	TAIN TECHNICAL OR HAZARDOUS DUTIES.
4	(a) Increase in Additional Compensation Cur-
5	RENTLY PROVIDED TO CERTAIN OFFICERS.—Section 302
6	of the District of Columbia Police and Firemen's Salary
7	Act of 1958 (D.C. Code, sec. 4–411), is amended—
8	(1) in subsection (b)(2), by striking "\$810 per
9	annum" and inserting "\$1,500 per annum"; and
10	(2) in subsection (c), by striking "\$595 per
11	annum" each place it appears and inserting "\$1,250
12	per annum".
13	(b) Additional Compensation for Officers
14	Performing Certain Hazardous Duties.—
15	(1) In General.—Section 302 of such Act
16	(D.C. Code, sec. 4–411) is amended—
17	(A) by redesignating subsections (d), (e),
18	and (f) as subsections (f), (g), and (h); and
19	(B) by inserting after subsection (c) the
20	following new subsections:
21	"(d) Each officer or member of the United States
22	Park Police force or the United States Secret Service Uni-
23	formed Division who performs duties in the detection, dis-
24	ruption, or disposal of explosive devices or chemical or bio-
25	logical devices or agents, shall receive \$2,500 per annum
26	in addition to his or her scheduled rate of basic compensa-

- 2 tion under this subsection shall not be entitled to addi-
- 3 tional compensation under subsection (b)(2).
- 4 "(e) Each officer or member of the United States Se-
- 5 cret Service Uniformed Division who travels in connection
- 6 with the protection of the President of the United States,
- 7 Vice President of the United States, or their immediate
- 8 families, or any person under the protection of the United
- 9 States Secret Service, to any foreign nation in which a
- 10 United States Department of State travel advisory has
- 11 been issued, or to any foreign nation in which a state of
- 12 war or civil unrest exists (as certified by the Department
- 13 of State), shall receive \$100 per day in addition to his
- 14 or her scheduled rate of basic compensation and travel ex-
- 15 penses (or, if applicable, the officer's or member's per
- 16 diem) for each day the officer or member remains in that
- 17 nation.".

7	SEC. 2. TREATMENT OF ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION PAID
8	FOR SERVICE LONGEVITY.
9	(a) In General.—Paragraph (3) of section 401(a)
10	of the District of Columbia Police and Firemen's Salary
11	Act of 1958 (D.C. Code, sec. 4–415(a)) is amended to
12	read as follows:
13	"(3) Any additional compensation paid to an of-
14	ficer or member in accordance with paragraph (1)
15	shall be—
16	"(A) paid in the same manner as the basic
17	compensation to which the officer or member is
18	entitled;
19	"(B) subject to deduction and withholding
20	for retirement and insurance; and
21	"(C) considered as salary for the purpose
22	of computing annuities pursuant to the Police-
23	men and Firemen's Retirement and Disability
24	Act and chapter 84 of title 5, United States
25	Code, and for the purpose of computing insur-

- ed States Code.".
- 3 (b) Conforming Amendment.—Paragraph (6) of
- 4 subsection (a) of the Policemen and Firemen's Retirement
- 5 and Disability Act (D.C. Code, sec. 4–607(6)), is amended
- 6 by striking "assignment" and inserting "assignment (and,
- 7 in the case of officers or members of the Metropolitan Po-
- 8 lice force, the Fire Department of the District of Colum-
- 9 bia, the United States Park Police force, and the United
- 10 States Secret Service Uniformed Division, any additional
- 11 compensation received in accordance with section 401 of
- 12 the District of Columbia Police and Firemen's Salary Act
- 13 of 1958)".
- 14 SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.
- The amendments made by this Act shall apply with
- 16 respect to pay periods beginning on or after the first day
- 17 of the first month which begins after the date of the enact-
- 18 ment of this Act.
