## A BILL

To prohibit the transfer of a handgun by a licensed dealer unless the transferee states that the transferee is not the subject of a restraining order with respect to an intimate partner or child of the transferee.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1	SECTION 1. PROHIBITION OF THE TRANSFER OF A HAND-
2	GUN BY A LICENSED DEALER UNLESS THE
3	TRANSFEREE STATES THAT THE TRANS-
4	FEREE IS NOT THE SUBJECT OF A RESTRAIN-
5	ING ORDER WITH RESPECT TO AN INTIMATE
6	PARTNER OR CHILD OF THE TRANSFEREE.
7	Section 922(s)(3)(B) of title 18, United States Code,
8	is amended—
9	(1) by striking "and" at the end of clause (vi);
10	and
11	(2) by adding "and" at the end of clause (vii);
12	and
13	(3) by adding at the end the following:
14	"(viii) is not subject to a court order
15	that—
16	"(I) restrains the transferee from
17	harassing, stalking, or threatening an inti-
18	mate partner of the transferee or child of
19	such intimate partner or transferee, or en-
20	gaging in other conduct that would place
21	an intimate partner in reasonable fear of
22	bodily injury to the partner or child;
23	"(II) was issued after a hearing of
24	which the transferee received actual notice,
25	and at which the transferee had the oppor-
26	tunity to participate; and

1	"(III)(aa) includes a finding that the
2	transferee represents a credible threat to
3	the physical safety of such intimate part-
4	ner or child; or
5	"(bb) by its terms explicitly prohibits
6	the use, attempted use, or threatened use
7	of physical force against such intimate
8	partner or child that would reasonably be
9	expected to cause bodily injury."
