A BILL

To amend the Communications Act of 1934 to prohibit Internet service providers from providing accounts to sexually violent predators.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PROHIBITION ON PROVISION OF INTERNET**
4 **SERVICE ACCOUNTS TO SEXUALLY VIOLENT**
5 **PREDATORS.**

6 Part I of title II of the Communications Act of 1934
7 (47 U.S.C. 201 et seq.) is amended by adding at the end
8 the following:

4 “(a) PROHIBITION.—An interactive computer service
5 may not provide an account or otherwise provide for the
6 use of any information service, system, or access software
7 of such service to a sexually violent predator.

8 "(b) PENALTY.—Whoever violates subsection (a)
9 shall be subject to a civil fine of not more than \$5,000
10 for each violation. For purposes of this subsection, each
11 day of violation shall constitute a separate violation.

12 "(c) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

13 “(1) INTERACTIVE COMPUTER SERVICE.—The
14 term ‘interactive computer service’ has the meaning
15 given the term in section 230(e)(2).

16 “(2) SEXUALLY VIOLENT PREDATOR.—The
17 term ‘sexually violent predator’ means an individual
18 who—

19 “(A) is a sexually violent predator (as that
20 term is defined in section 170101(a)(3) of the
21 Violent Crime Control and Law Enforcement
22 Act of 1994 (42 U.S.C. 14071(a)(3))); and

1 14071(a)(1)(B), 14072(c)), as provided under
2 section 170101(b)(6)(B) or 170102(d)(2), re-
3 spectively, of that Act.”.
