To amend the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. STANDARDS.

2 Section 6(b)(2) of the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 (29 U.S.C 655(b)(2)) is amended by 3 inserting after the first sentence the following: "The notice 4 5 in the Federal Register shall include identification of the specific industry or industries to which the standard, to 7 be promulgated under the rule, will apply. In promulgating a standard, the Secretary shall ensure that the stand-9 ard, as applicable to each such industry, is based upon an assessment of the risks to workers in such industry 10 from the hazard which is the subject of the standard, the 11 range of estimates and the best estimate of the quantifiable and nonquantifiable benefits of the standard in each 13 such industry, and an analysis of the costs likely to occur in each such industry as a result of compliance with the standard.". 16

17 SECTION 1. STANDARDS.
