A BILL

To prohibit the Secretary of Transportation from imposing certain requirements relating to the unloading of cargo tank vehicles in liquefied compressed gas service.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. UNLOADING OF CARGO TANK VEHICLES IN LIQ-
- 4 UEFIED COMPRESSED GAS SERVICE.
- 5 (a) In General.—The Secretary of Transportation
- 6 may not impose any requirement under chapter 51 of title
- 7 49, United States Code, or any other provision of law that,
- 8 in the case of the unloading of a cargo tank vehicle in
- 9 liquefied compressed gas service, has the effect of—

1 (1) requiring more than 1 attendant for the un2 loading; or
3 (2) preventing the attendant from being posi4 tioned at the customer storage tank during the un5 loading.
6 (b) Regulations.—Any regulation issued by the
7 Secretary before the date of the enactment of this Act that
8 is inconsistent with subsection (a) shall no longer be effec9 tive.
